For the academic year 2022-23, the feedback about the syllabus was collected from the stakeholders. All these feedbacks were collected by using a five-point rating scale and analysed using excel software.

TEACHERS FEEDBACK ANALYSIS ON CURRICULUM

The teacher's feedback form consists of questions that truly indicated their satisfaction level of the students about the Curriculum. Given below are the conclusions obtained by analyzing the student feedback for the academic year 2022 - 2023.

- A combined 81% (20.2% strongly agree + 60.8% agree) agree that the curriculum is need-based, suggesting a strong consensus.
- A significant 82.8% (21.5% strongly agree + 61.3% agree) believe that the aims and objectives of the curriculum are well-defined.
- The majority, 82.2% (20.7% strongly agree + 61.5% agree), agrees that the curriculum maintains a good balance between theoretical concepts and practical application, showcasing a strong consensus.
- Significant 87.6% (25.4% strongly agree + 62.2% agree) express that the curriculum has successfully sparked interest in the subject, contributing to a positive learning experience.
- The majority, 91.8% (32.5% strongly agree + 59.3% agree), acknowledges that the curriculum is well-supported by reference materials.
- An overwhelming 95.2% (37% strongly agree + 58.2% agree) agree that there is an adequate availability of prescribed books in the library, indicating a highly positive perception.
- A combined 69.4% (18.2% strongly agree + 51.2% agree) agree that the curriculum has contributed to an increased knowledge and perspective within the subject area.

- A significant 85.3% (27.2% strongly agree + 58.1% agree) feel that the curriculum provides an adequate number of optional papers for a diversified learning experience.
- An overwhelming 89.2% (33.5% strongly agree + 55.7% agree) believe that tests and examinations are conducted effectively, covering all curriculum units.
- A combined 77% (31.5% strongly agree + 45.5% agree) feel empowered to incorporate innovative teaching techniques, fostering a positive environment for creative pedagogy.
- The opinions are divided, with 53.3% (15.1% strongly agree + 38.2% agree) indicating agreement.
- A strong majority of 84.5% (21.5% strongly agree + 63% agree) believe that the department's environment supports the successful implementation of new curriculum changes.
- A combined 65.4% (16.2% strongly agree + 49.2% agree) agree that there are provisions for developing new teaching practices within the curriculum.
